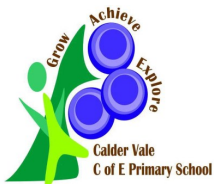

### Bluebell Class

In music, we played instruments to the pulse of different songs themed around the great fire of London.

In Maths, EYFS have been learning about addition and putting 2 amounts together to see how many we have altogether whilst KS1 have been sorting and collecting data in tables and bar charts. In English this week we have all read the story 10 Little Robots. EYFS have created their own robots whilst KS1 have used joining words to write sentences. We have all enjoyed creating our own 10 little .... stories. Our science work this week has been about our senses of sight and sound. We had fun exploring how our sight is different in the dark and with 1 eye closed and used our hearing to guess different sounds. What a busy week!!

Willow Class have had an exciting and productive week! In Science, the children conducted an investigation into resistance by testing how different surfaces affect movement of a marble. Our Year 5 and 6 children represented us brilliantly at GCA, taking part in the Small Schools Glow-in-the-Dark Dodgeball competition. Each morning, all children have been working hard on their daily comprehension tasks, showing great focus and determination. In RE, they created colourful and informative posters exploring how Christmas is celebrated by Christians around the world. On Wednesday, Year 6 visited the Wyre Borough Council head offices to take part in a democracy event, gaining valuable insight into local decision-making. During Computing, they learned about copyright and how to use digital content responsibly. 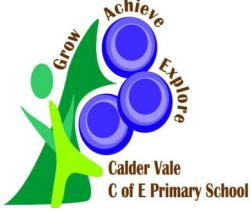


**Bluebell Class** – Ellie R for making huge progress in her number and writing, growing in confidence and independence.
