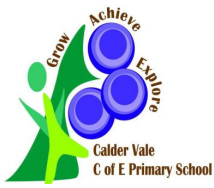

Moses - read and made his bed every day and raised £5

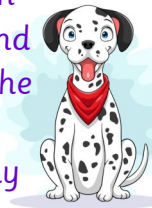
Eleanor - walked every day and raised £70

Hopefully the works will be completed ahead of schedule


LANCASHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL
(DELPH LANE, OAKENCLOUGH, BLEASDALE, WYRE BOROUGH)
(TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF THROUGH TRAFFIC) ORDER 2025

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Lancashire County Council has made an Order under Section 14(1) (a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, the effect of which will be to temporarily prohibit traffic on the roads set out in this Order.

1. No person shall cause any motor vehicle to proceed over that length of Delph Lane, Oakencloough from a point approximately 33 metres south of "The Row" to a point approximately 22 metres north of the entrance to "Bog House".
2. Nothing in this Order shall apply to persons engaged in the carrying out of the works.
3. The prohibition will be operative from 0800 hours on Monday 10th March 2025 until 1700 hours on Wednesday 12th March 2025 or until completion of the works within this period.
4. Vehicular access for residents will be maintained whenever and wherever possible. Pedestrian access to properties will always be maintained.
5. An alternative route for vehicular traffic affected by the closure is via:
Bleasdale Lane <-> Hobbs Lane <-> Butt Hill Lane <-> Sandholme Lane <-> Strickens Lane

The temporary prohibition is necessary to allow new water connection works to be carried out by Network Plus on behalf of United Utilities.
