Bluebell Class

Bluebells have been superstars this week! Key stage one have been writing their own versions of 'Polar Bear Polar Bear' using verbs and question marks. We are really improving our handwriting. Reception and pre school have found out lots about polar bears and have been trying to write words and captions as well as telling the story 'That's Not My Polar Bear' in open learning. In maths reception have been comparing quantities within 10 and practising writing numbers. Key stage one have been doing some tricky subtraction with exchange, it really makes our brains work!! In topic we have carried on with our printing work around Orla Kiely, we designed and made our own tiles to create our own designs. Reception have looked at the artist Claude Monet and have used watercolours to create winter pictures. In science we have practised the skill of observation, spotting similarities and differences in different items.
